GLOBAL LINKAGES Water Project


The Global Linkages Water Project started on Giving Tuesday 2023 after a core group of past travelers discovered Water Is Life Kenya and began working with the non-profit to bring fresh, clean water to the Olmoti Maasai community living at the base of Mount Kilimanjaro. Ambassadors committed to swimming laps and walking for water, presented to organizations, sold dinners, and enlisted help from local barber and coffee shops. The group is looking to raise \$100,000 by December 2024 to drill a borehole for the Olmoti, making way for this trip which will allow the group to plant trees in the community made possible because of the new fresh, clean water. Nairobi is Kenya's capital, and its largest city—with a population over 4.7 million. It is in the southcentral region of Kenya, in the highlands, at an elevation of approximately 5,500 feet. The city originated in the 1890s as a colonial railway settlement, and from about 1900 onward, a small Indian bazaar and trading center was established. As a government center, Nairobi began attracting migrants from rural Kenya, making it one of the largest cities in Africa. It is the principal industrial center of the country, with the railways being the largest single employer. Nairobi is also home to manufacturing industries, and tourism is a key business. In addition to its urban core, the city is home to Nairobi National Park, a large game reserve known for breeding endangered black rhinos and home to numerous mammals, reptiles and birds.





In the heart of Nairobi, the Fairview Hotel is the secret gem of Nairobi's Upper Hill. Surrounded by lush gardens, woven with intricate pathways, the atmosphere creates an oasis of calm for anyone who stays here. MEETING THE OLMOTI

All participants will receive a briefing on the Olmoti Community Development Organization, Global Linkages' beneficiary community partner for the Borehole Water Project. Olmoti is a big community with limited economic activity other than cattle breeding. Olmoti is located along the Kenyan/Tanzanian border and the national park of Amboseli. This community, distant from urban areas, is on the corridor of Kitenden, one of the best places to see Mount Kilimanjaro's peak. A three-year drought left the Olmotis without water for themselves and their livestock, which inspired the Global Linkages Water Project.

The Maasai Market is an open-air market where you can find curios, paintings, jewelry, clothes and fabric, wood carvings, batik wall hangings, soap, stone and more. The market was named after the Maasai, one of the most popular tribes in Kenya. This is a roving market that can be found in different locations depending on the day of the week. Enjoy bartering with the sellers and expect to walk away with some great deals (with the recognition that this is the sellers' livelihood.)



Those interested in this experience will visit the Giraffe Centre, the creation of the African Fund for Endangered Wildlife (A.F.E.W. Kenya), a Kenyan non-profit organization. The main purpose is to educate Kenyan school children and youth on their country's wildlife and environment, as well as give local and international visitors an opportunity to come into close contact with the world's tallest species, the giraffe.



Born from one family's passion for Kenya and its wilderness, the **David Sheldrick Wildlife Trust** is the most successful orphan-elephant rescue and rehabilitation program in the world and one of the pioneering conservation organizations for wildlife and habitat protection in East Africa. To date, they have successfully hand-raised over 150 infant elephants!

KIBO SAFARI CAMP



Kibo Safari Camp is a luxury-tented camp that lies within Amboseli National Park at the foot of Mount Kilimanjaro, the highest free-standing mountain in Africa. Amboseli is the core of a 3,100 square-mile ecosystem that spreads across the Kenya-Tanzania border, and is famous for being the best place in Africa to get close to free-ranging elephants among other wildlife species. Other attractions include opportunities to meet the Maasai people, including the Olmoti.

Learning about the Olmoti and the Water Is Life Kenya (WILK) Program!

Water is Life Kenya (WILK) is a 501(c)(3) registered non-profit organization founded by Joyce Tannian of Newark, Delaware and Joseph Larasha of Kenya. It is a US-based charitable organization which for 17 years has worked primarily with indigenous Maasai people in southern Kenya. It exists to spark personal, economic, and community development in marginalized communities in Kenya, according to existing customs and culture, by providing clean water, sanitation and hygiene, empowering women, and equipping people to develop income by managing their resources. Through WILK's clean water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) program, they have completed 30 WASH projects, provided clean water to 100,000 people, and freed up 2 million annual hours per community with each new borehole.

DAYS 7-8 service activities





The government launched a campaign to plant 15 billion trees in ten years from 2022 in a bid to reach 30% tree cover in Kenya. The campaign aims at reducing greenhouse emissions, stopping, and reversing deforestation. The second phase of the Global Linkages Water Project encouraged donations for planting a tree in someone's honor, which is a key reason for this trip.



Olmoti Primary School provides education from grades 1 through 4, with preparations for levels up to grade 7. Global Linkages travelers often visit schools to connect with children and deliver muchneeded supplies and donations.





Founded in 2009, My Chosen Vessels (MCV) is a 501(c)(3) Organization in the USA & a registered NGO (Non-Governmental Organization) in Kenya. Its mission is to empower Maasai people through water, education and culture conservation initiatives.
